During the week of Aug. 26th, all students will participate in lessons to review RESPECTFUL, RESPONSIBLE, READY, and SAFE expectations across all settings in the building. Ask your children to let you know when they receive PAW tickets! Golden Tickets: Every month, each teacher will award one student in his/her class the "Golden Ticket" for being or showing exceptional improvement or effort at being either Respectful, Responsible, Ready or Safe in all areas of the school. When a student wins the "Golden Ticket," he/she is recognized on the morning announcements and receives a GOLDEN TICKET spirit stick. The student's picture is also placed on the "Principal's Club" bulletin board in the cafeteria and has lunch with the principal at the Golden Ticket Luncheon. In September, the entire student body will focus on ADAPTABILITY. If provision of instructional supplies imposes a financial hardship on a family, the school district can assist with some of these costs. The application process is located under MCSD Policy IIO on the district website: www.mcsdkl2.org. Families may also contact Mr. Reeder to see if they qualify for assistance with school materials.

academic Assistance

If your child is struggling academically or not attaining the academic standards at the proficient level, please reach out to your child's teacher or the building principal for information about our tutoring programs and accessing additional academic assistance.

<u> Tier 2 Behavioral Support</u>

East Derry has systems in place to identify and assist students in need of behavioral supports. Each month, a Tier 2 team analyzes discipline referrals to determine if students are in need of more support. If your child has frequent "minor" discipline referrals or any "major" discipline referrals, a team member will be in contact for parent permission to help eliminate barriers and assist the student. Parents may also reach out to their child's teacher or the school counselor to see if Tier 2 supports may be of assistance.



Skylert/Family Access: The Skylert System is the main source of family contact for important district information, including transportation arrangements, academic information, attendance, discipline records, delays and snow days. East Derry must have accurate information stored in our Skyward system to relay messages to parents/guardians. Please notify the office immediately of changes in contact information. 717-543-5615

Curriculm Policy 10 5.1: Mifflin County School District School Board Policy 105.1 requires annual notification to parents/guardians and students that parents/guardians and students have an opportunity to review instructional materials and have access to information about the curriculum, including academic standards to be achieved, instructional materials and access information about the curriculum, including academic standards to be achieved, instructional materials and assessment techniques should be made by submitting a written request to the building principal.

Right to Know

As a parent of a student attending a school that is receiving Federal Title I dollars, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teacher(s) and instructional paraprofessional(s) who instruct your child. Federal law requires every Title I school district to comply and to provide you with the requested information in a timely manner. We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching,
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

You may also ask whether your child receives help from a paraprofessional. If your child receives this assistance, we can provide you with information about the paraprofessional's qualifications. The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), which was signed into law in December 2015 and reauthorizes the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1956 (ESEA), includes additional right to know requests. At any time, parents and family members can request:

- Information on policies regarding student participation in assessments and procedures for opting out, and
- Information on required assessments that include: subject matter tested, purpose of the test, source of the requirement (if applicable), amount of time it takes students to complete the test, and time and format of disseminating results.

Our staff is committed to helping your child develop the academic knowledge and critical thinking he/she needs to succeed in school and beyond. That commitment includes making sure that all of our teachers and paraprofessionals meet applicable Pennsylvania state requirements.
