Open House

We are so excited to welcome our students and families to Open House on **Thursday**, **9/5 from 5:30pm to 7pm**. This will be a chance for your child to show you their classroom and for you to meet their teacher. Specials and title teachers, our school counselor, and our principal will also be present and our school secretary will be available with volunteer information. There will also be a Resource Fair with agencies who provide services in our area.

Breakfast & Lunch

SMES is a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school, meaning all SMES students are eligible to receive breakfast and lunch free of charge.

Free/reduced meal applications will not be distributed to SMES students. Instead, you will receive an economic information survey. Please be sure to send it back to school with your student.



Students who are eligible for free and reduced lunch may request an application for instructional supplies by contacting the main office/principal

Reminders

- » Excuses are due within 3 days after an absence
- » Students arriving between 8:20 & 9:30am are tardy
- >> Students arriving after 9:30am or leaving before 2pm will receive 1/2 day's absence
- Students leaving after 2pm receive an early dismissal, but receive credit for a full day
- Students are allowed 5 educational trip days per school year with approved form
- Always include your students first AND LAST name on notes



PSA

SMES is very fortunate to have a very active and dedicated Parent/School Association (PSA). The PSA organizes activities and events for our students and plans fundraisers to fund them. If you would like to be a part of the SMES PSA, plan to attend a monthly meeting. They are held every the second Tuesday of each month.

The first meeting will be held on 9/10 immediately following the Title I Schoolwide Planning meeting, around 6pm.

Please know, childcare is not available. Please make alternate arrangements for your children. In the event of an emergency, your child must sit at the table with you and be escorted to/from the restroom.

Volunteering

Opportunities throughout the school year will allow us to welcome volunteers into the classrooms and school. In order to be eligible to volunteer, the following is required:

- » Act 34 PA Criminal History Clearance
- » Act 151 PA Child Abuse History Clearance
- Act 114 Federal Criminal History & Fingerprinting or Volunteer Affidavit in lieu (restrictions apply)
- Volunteer Packet (required to be completed each school year)

As an additional layer of security, your driver's license (or state ID) will need to be scanned into our visitor management database, School Gate Guardian, to receive a visitor's badge.

Busing Announcements

- » All kindergarten students require a parent/guardian present at the bus stop.
- » Be at the bus stop waiting for your student. If they do not get off, ask the driver to call out for them. Often times, younger students fall asleep.
- On occasions, bus routes cannot be completed. In these cases, a Skylert is sent out and the notice is posted to the website. Always update the office with phone, address, and email changes so that you can be made aware of these announcements.



Parent Pickup

Remember to send a note to school with your child if they will be a parent pickup at dismissal. This allows the teacher to make note of the student's dismissal plan and send to the office to be added to the list and notify all staff involved in dismissal which makes a safe and stress-free dismissal.


Backpack Donation

Title I Schoolwide Plan

We will discuss how our Title I schoolwide funds support our elementary focus statements, a Multi-Tier System of Support (MTSS), curriculum development, ongoing professional development for our teachers, Positive Behavior Interventions & Support (PBIS), Camp on Your Way to Kindergarten, supplemental resources, and evidence based interventions.

Right to Know

As a parent of a student attending a school that is receiving Federal Title I dollars, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teacher(s) and instructional paraprofessional(s) who instruct your child. Federal law requires every Title I school district to comply and to provide you with the requested information in a timely manner. We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching,
- » Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

You may also ask whether your child receives help from a paraprofessional. If your child receives the assistance, we can provide you with information about the paraprofessional's qualifications. In order to be as prepared as possible, we will be practicing safety drills throughout the school year. We will be providing instruction to your student on protocols for fire, evacuation, severe weather, and intruder drills (lockdown). During this instruction, teachers at SMES will lead students through a series of steps so that they are as prepared as possible in the event of a real-life situation.

SMES plans to conduction a lockdown drill during the month of September. We will invite local Emergency Management and PA State Police to participate in our security drill so they can provide us with valuable feedback on our safety drill procedures.

Curriculum
