MORNING MEETINGS & STATUS CHECKS

What are Morning Meetings?

Every morning, during first period, teachers facilitate Morning Meetings with their classes. The topics discussed range from light-hearted preferences like favorite candy bars to more substantial subjects such as coping skills. Students have the option to actively participate or choose to observe.

Why do we do Morning Meetings?

The overarching goal of these meetings is to foster stronger bonds between the staff and students, ultimately cultivating a greater sense of community within the school environment.

What is a Status Check?

In addition to Morning Meetings, students utilize the PBIS app to complete a "Status Check." This tool serves as a means for students to monitor their own mental well-being and assess their readiness to engage in learning. If a student consistently indicates feelings of anger, sadness, or stress, the School Counselor will arrange a meeting with him or her and, if necessary, reach out to a parent or guardian.

The staff at MCMS encourages all students to embrace this opportunity.

SHAPE THE SKY

Shape the Sky (shapethesky.org) is an educational resource designed to help parents, educators, and other adults guide young people in using smartphones, technology, and social media responsibly. As a middle school parent, here's how you could use Shape the Sky to support your child:



1. Access Educational Resources

- Workshops & Blogs: The website offers blog posts, videos, and workshops that discuss trends, apps, and tips
 related to technology and social media. By reviewing these, you can better understand the digital world your
 middle schooler navigates.
- **Technology & App Reviews:** Shape the Sky keeps adults updated on apps that teens are using, explaining both their benefits and potential risks. This helps parents make informed decisions about what apps are appropriate for their children.

2. Set Digital Guidelines

- **Digital Responsibility Tools:** Shape the Sky encourages creating family agreements about technology use. This can include setting screen time limits, discussing which apps are allowed, and creating rules for online behavior.
- Social Media Safety: The website provides guidelines on monitoring your child's social media accounts and ensuring privacy settings are properly configured.

3. Model Responsible Technology Use

• Lead by Example: Shape the Sky emphasizes the importance of adults modeling positive behavior. Parents can use the guidance on the site to show their children how to balance screen time, avoid oversharing, and use social media constructively.


- Senior Citizen, Active Military, and Veteran Free Athletic Passes can be obtained at the MCHS Main Office. All passes are good for life.

OCTOBER HEALTH SCREENINGS

On October 15, 16, and 17, 2024, the health screenings will take place at Mifflin County Middle School. Vision screenings will be administered to both 6th and 7th graders and hearing screenings to 7th graders by the Tuscarora Intermediate Unit. All students will also have a height and weight check as well as their scoliosis screening done by the school nurse. Please be sure your student wears their contacts or glasses these days. Thanks for your help!

REMINDERS FROM THE NURSE



6th Grade Physical Examinations: The school nurse will accept a completed physical examination from up to one year prior to the first day of school this year or at any time during the sixth-grade year. A copy of the child's immunization record must be completed and turned in with the physical.

Any student going into 7th grade without documented TDAP and Meningococcal vaccines, an exemption on file, or a med cert (documented upcoming doctor appointment on file with the school nurse) will be excluded from school until one of these three things are obtained. **Remember that exclusion day is September 4, 2024.

7th Grade Dental: The school nurse will accept a dental form dated from up to one year prior to the school start date or anytime during their seventh-grade year. It is a state requirement that every student in 7th grade must have a dental exam. All physical/dental forms can be picked up in the main office or downloaded from the district website.

EDUCATIONAL TRIP REPORT FORMS

If a student is planning on going on a trip/vacation, an Educational Trip Report Form must be completed in order for the student's absences to be excused. These are available in the MCMS Main Office and the MCSD website by clicking on "Students/Parents," and then "Forms and Flyers." Forms should be submitted 2-3 weeks prior to the trip. A written report is required to be submitted following the student's return to school for absences to be excused.
