November PBIS Challenge Winner- 9th Grade

On November 26th, the MCJH PBIS team sponsored an activity period for the winners of a "grade wars challenge" between the 8th and 9th grade classes. During the month of November, each grade was challenged to decrease their number of cell phone violations, and the class with less violations at the end of the month won an activity period filled with fun, games, and prizes. 9th graders won and spent the afternoon playing bingo, basketball tournaments, and relay races. Mrs. Shomaker's Science Classes

Students in Mrs. Schomaker's science classes were recently treated to a demo day by Juniata College Science in Motion. The topic of these activities was chemical reactions. Students learned about elements that conduct electricity by using a Tesla coil, and they held methane-filled fire bubbles.

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Students completed STEM challenges on the day before Thanksgiving break. They competed in a cup stacking challenge, a bridge building competition, and a task to build a table out of newspaper.

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Soup Sale Mrs. Wagner's Class

Mrs. Wagner's Autistic Support/Life Skills class has started holding a soup sale once a month. Teachers are able to order soup for lunch or quarts to take home. The students

help to prepare the soup by chopping vegetables, making condiment packs, putting crackers in bags, packaging the lunches, and serving the teachers. Each month the class offers two different kinds of soup to serve. Students are learning valuable meal preparation and job training skills.



Homeless Awareness Month

Students handed out stickers at lunches to bring awareness to the importance of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act and the education needed to provide stability and consistency to students experiencing homelessness across Pennsylvania. Many people associate being homeless with living on the street, but homelessness is often hidden, especially in rural communities.

Spanish Club

In October, Spanish Club members met to create a craft called "Ojo de dios," or "Eye of God." The Huichol Native Americans of Mexico made these as a symbol of the power of seeing and understanding unseen things. The four points of the crossed sticks represent earth, air, water, and fire. The "Ojo de dios" is also a physical representation of praying for health, fortune, and a long life.

"A Million Thanks" provides support and appreciation to our active and veteran military men and women through sending letters and granting betterment of life wishes, as well as providing higher education scholarships to their children. 

Student Assistance Program (SAP)

The MCJH Student Assistance Program (SAP) Team is a group of professionals dedicated to helping to identify and assist students who may be struggling with life issues that are interfering with school performance. The SAP team consists of teachers, administrators, school counselors, social workers, nurses, and representatives from community agencies who have been specially trained to work with students and make appropriate referrals. This help is provided in a completely non disciplinary way. Based on the diverse needs of our students, this process may include an interview with a member of the SAP team, a counseling group, or individual counseling with the school-based therapist or social worker. Services may include academic support; behavior management; drug and alcohol education, prevention, assessment and treatment through Clear Concepts; anger management; mental health assessment through the Youth Advocate Program; conflict resolution, or involvement in community agencies. All SAP-related services are free and confidential. A parent or guardian must sign a permission for SAP services. Any student, parent, or teacher may make a referral. If you have concerns for a MCSD student in grades K12, please contact an administrator, school counselor, or school nurse.
