February 4-8 is National School Counseling Week, and the theme for 2025 is "School Counseling: Helping Students Thrive." The MCMS School Counselors are Mr. Andy McCardell for 6th grade, and Mrs. Jane Foor, who has 7th grade. Our school counselors help students thrive by using the school's academic, attendance, and discipline data, to remove barriers to learning as well as encouraging students to examine their abilities, strengths and interests. Our school counselors follow the ASCA National Model to provide individual counseling to students on an as-needed basis, collaborate



with families and community providers to ensure students have access to mental health services, run small groups to address low grades and mental health issues, and provide classroom lessons on executive functioning skills and career exploration. MCMS BAND NEWS






ATHLETIC NEWS





CLASSROOM SPOTLIGHT: MRS. HARTMAN'S 6TH GRADE SCIENCE

Mrs. Hartman's 6th grade science students spent much of December and January learning about tectonic plate movement and earthquakes. After spending time researching how engineers design buildings in earthquake prone areas, students are designing and building their own earthquake resistant structures using simple materials like marshmallows, spaghetti sticks, and tape. During the building process, students are using model earthquake boards to mimic earthquake waves and test their structure's earthquake resistance.
